EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

MARCH 2, 2025

Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time Commentary

First Reading: Sirach 27:4-7

Ecclesiasticus, also Ben Sirach or Sirach, belongs to the Wisdom Tradition or Wisdom Literature of Ancient Israel. Originally written in Hebrew in 197 BCE, and translated into Greek in 132 BCE, after the original Hebrew was lost, Sirach was composed in the time of the Diaspora. It was meant to affirm Jewish fidelity to the Law and Tradition before the onslaught of Greek or Hellenic culture. Wisdom here is understood as "profound insight into ordinary human experience." It is based on three chronological moments, namely: first, experience of material reality; second, repetition and observation, and, finally, reflection and insight. The insight: one's truth and reality are known through trials and tribulation. The just will always be tested. One's true character or basic orientation in life is revealed in one's speech. Absence of praise before one speaks is itself one's own test. Such is the fruit of reflection of the observable things that happen in human experience. That too is the law of nature and of divine order.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:54-58

Paul's presentation defending the resurrection of the body reaches its climax. He frames his argument within the context of the Parousia, and the radical transformation that it effects. He uses the imagery of "clothing" and the contrasts of two word-pairs "corruptibility/in incorruptibility", and "mortality/immortality". The "corruptible" is "mortal"; the "in corruptible" "immortal". It is at this point that Paul, paraphrasing Hos 13:14 and Is 25:8, affirms the fulfilment of this Old Testament promise: death is defeated, it has no more sting. It cannot harm the new radically transformed creation with sin, because it is not dependent anymore on the Law. The body has been freed from the Law. Jesus Christ is the radical alternative to the life of the law. And the body and all creation now participate in his glorious resurrection, in his new radically transformed resurrected body. The ethic of dénouement follows: the spirituality of life as living in the work of the Lord, doing the work of the Lord. It is this vision of the resurrection of Jesus Christ that ought to shape the life of the Corinthian Christian community as the Body of Christ, clothed in glory, doing the works of the gains of the resurrection!

Gospel: Luke 6:39-45

After Jesus formed the Twelve as an intimate community of disciples around him, he followed this by proclaiming the programmatic blessings and woes of the primacy of the Kingdom of God. From now on, the Kingdom of God and its values would be the perspective of looking at life and society, at concrete human and material reality. The ethic of utopian radical love would now be the standard of measuring what is truly just and merciful, on the one hand, and unjust and unloving, on the other. Now, two tasks remain to be done for the community of disciples, and all Christians for that matter, to be able to live this new liberated life. (1) The disciples need to be formed and to grow in awareness according to the teachings of Jesus, the teacher. This

means a liberation of their minds and hearts from the old customary teachings to the new way of thinking and loving according to the alternative of Jesus. And (2) the need for auto-criticism: a personal self-criticism and communal criticism to discern the will of God and its realization together. Auto-criticism and social criticism would prevent blindness and narcissism to cloud the life, mind and heart of the members of the Christian community, personally and communally. – Fr. Ben, MSC

OCTAVO DOMINGO DE TIEMPO ORDINARIO

MARZO 2, 2025

Octavo Domingo de Tiempo Ordinario Comentario

Primera lectura: Eclesiástico 27, 4-7

El Eclesiástico, también Ben Sirá o Sirá, pertenece a la Tradición Sapiencial o Literatura Sapiencial del Antiguo Israel. Escrito originalmente en hebreo en el año 197 a. C. y traducido al griego en el año 132 a. C., después de que se perdiera el original hebreo, el Sirá fue compuesto en tiempos de la diáspora. Su propósito era afirmar la fidelidad judía a la Ley y la Tradición antes de la embestida de la cultura griega o helénica. La sabiduría aquí se entiende como “una profunda comprensión de la experiencia humana ordinaria”. Se basa en tres momentos cronológicos, a saber: primero, la experiencia de la realidad material; segundo, la repetición y la observación, y, finalmente, la reflexión y la comprensión. La comprensión: la verdad y la realidad de uno se conocen a través de pruebas y tribulaciones. El justo siempre será puesto a prueba. El verdadero carácter o la orientación básica de la vida de uno se revela en el habla. La ausencia de alabanza antes de hablar es en sí misma una prueba para uno mismo. Tal es el fruto de la reflexión sobre las cosas observables que suceden en la experiencia humana. Eso también es ley de la naturaleza y del orden divino.

Segunda lectura: 1 Corintios 15,54-58

La presentación de Pablo defendiendo la resurrección del cuerpo llega a su clímax. Enmarca su argumento en el contexto de la Parusía y la transformación radical que ésta produce. Utiliza la imagen de la “vestidura” y los contrastes de dos pares de palabras: “corruptibilidad/incorrputibilidad” y “mortalidad/inmortalidad”. Lo “corruptible” es “mortal”; lo “incorruptible” es “inmortal”. Es en este punto que Pablo, parafraseando Os 13,14 e Is 25,8, afirma el cumplimiento de esta promesa del Antiguo Testamento: la muerte ha sido derrotada, ya no tiene aguijón. No puede dañar a la nueva creación radicalmente transformada con el pecado, porque ya no depende de la Ley. El cuerpo ha sido liberado de la Ley. Jesucristo es la alternativa radical a la vida de la ley. Y el cuerpo y toda la creación participan ahora de su gloriosa resurrección, de su nuevo cuerpo resucitado, radicalmente transformado. De ahí la ética del desenlace: la espiritualidad de la vida como vivir en la obra del Señor, haciendo la obra del Señor. ¡Es esta visión de la resurrección de Jesucristo la que debería dar forma a la vida de la comunidad cristiana de Corinto como Cuerpo de Cristo, revestido de gloria, haciendo las obras de los frutos de la resurrección!

Evangelio: Lucas 6,39-45

Después de formar a los Doce como una comunidad íntima de discípulos en torno a él, Jesús proclamó las bendiciones y las desgracias programáticas de la primacía del Reino de Dios. A partir de ahora, el Reino de Dios y sus valores serían la perspectiva desde la que mirar la vida y la sociedad, la realidad humana y material concreta. La ética del amor radical utópico sería ahora el estándar para medir lo que es verdaderamente justo y misericordioso, por un lado, e injusto y desamorado, por otro. Ahora

quedan dos tareas por hacer para que la comunidad de discípulos, y todos los cristianos en realidad, puedan vivir esta nueva vida liberada. (1) Los discípulos necesitan formarse y crecer en conciencia según las enseñanzas de Jesús, el maestro. Esto significa una liberación de sus mentes y corazones de las viejas enseñanzas habituales a la nueva forma de pensar y amar según la alternativa de Jesús. Y (2) la necesidad de la autocritica: una autocritica personal y una crítica comunitaria para discernir la voluntad de Dios y su realización conjunta. La autocritica y la crítica social evitarían que la ceguera y el narcisismo nublaran la vida, la mente y el corazón de los miembros de la comunidad cristiana, tanto a nivel personal como comunitario. – Padre Ben, MSC

CHIA SẺ LỜI CHÚA

Một trong những điều mà các cha chính xứ lớn tuổi và các linh mục trẻ thỉnh thoảng hay tranh luận là sự cân bằng thích hợp giữa công việc và cầu nguyện. Tôi biết một cha sở phàn nàn rằng vị linh mục cộng sự viên trẻ tuổi của cha phó lờ giáo dân và giáo xứ vì cha ấy muốn dành nhiều thời gian hơn cho việc cầu nguyện. Và vị linh mục trẻ phàn nàn rằng cha sở trao phó cho cha quá nhiều việc phải làm và cha không có thời giờ để cầu nguyện.

Những lời Thiên Chúa truyền dạy trong Chúa Nhật tuần này nói lên nỗi căng thẳng này qua một hình ảnh có thể giúp chúng ta tìm được sự cân bằng thích hợp giữa cuộc sống và việc cầu nguyện.

Chúa Giêsu dậy: “Xem quả thì biết cây. Vì người ta không hái vỏ nơi bụi gai, cũng không hái nho nơi bụi rậm” (Luca 6,44). Khi chúng ta bén rễ sâu và vun trồng mối tương quan giữa chúng ta với Chúa Giêsu, chúng ta sẽ kết sinh hoa trái nơi tình yêu đó trong cuộc sống cho chính mình. Không sinh hoa kết trái, không có lời cầu nguyện tốt lành. Làm thế nào để biết được lời chúng ta đang cầu nguyện là tốt? Chúng ta đang trải nghiệm kết tạo những hoa trái cụ thể nơi tình yêu thương người khác trong cuộc sống của chính chúng ta.

Người cầu nguyện tốt, không sờm thì muộn, sẽ nở ra những “trái sung” và “quả nho” của những hành động yêu thương. Nhưng nếu không có cam kết cụ thể về những việc làm phục vụ tha nhân với tinh thần vị tha thì thời gian cầu nguyện của chúng ta sẽ vô ích như bụi gai và bụi cây rậm rạp. Chúng ta hãy tái cam kết trở thành những người nam nữ cầu nguyện và phục vụ. Và hy vọng các cha sở sẽ giúp các cộng sự viên của các vị cầu nguyện và phục vụ một cách hiệu quả hơn... với rất ít lời tranh luận nhất!

Jubilee Year 2025 (7)

Dear OLPH Parishioners,

Let us continue to reflect prayerfully on the Holy Father Pope Francis' call to be Pilgrims of Hope in this Jubilee Year 2025, even as we continue to pray for his health and total well-being.

"Signs of hope"

"7. In addition to finding hope in God's grace, we are also called to discover hope in the signs of the times that the Lord gives us. As the Second Vatican Council observed: "In every age, the Church has the responsibility of reading the signs of the times and interpreting them in the light of the Gospel. In this way, in language adapted to every generation, she can respond to people's persistent questions about the meaning of this present life and of the life to come, and how one is related to the other". We need to recognize the immense goodness present in our world, lest we be tempted to think ourselves overwhelmed by evil and violence. The signs of the times, which include the yearning of human hearts in need of God's saving presence, ought to become signs of hope."

8. The first sign of hope should be the desire for peace in our world, which once more finds itself immersed in the tragedy of war. Heedless of the horrors of the past, humanity is confronting yet another ordeal, as many peoples are prey to brutality and violence. What does the future hold for those peoples, who have already endured so much? How is it possible that their desperate plea for help is not motivating world leaders to resolve the numerous regional conflicts in view of their possible consequences at the global level? Is it too much to dream that arms can fall silent and cease to rain down destruction and death? May the Jubilee remind us that those who are peacemakers will be called "children of God" (Mt 5:9). The need for peace challenges us all, and demands that concrete steps be taken. May diplomacy be tireless in its commitment to seek, with

courage and creativity, every opportunity to undertake negotiations aimed at a lasting peace."

It would be instructive for us to meditate on this sign of hope in our time: the yearning for peace, the blessing of being peacemakers and commitment to diplomacy and negotiations for a lasting peace. Let us allow this desire for peace and the rejection of war and violence to critique our long-held positions and propensity for war: to defend ourselves, let us prepare for war; to keep our freedom, let us suppress and support the suppression of others in other lands. More profoundly, we need to ask ourselves: who are causing these wars? Aren't we offering ourselves and our children to the theaters of war and on the altar of violence, not for ourselves though we are made to believe so, but for a few who want to control the geopolitics of resources and power? War, its violence and its horrors are the anti-thesis to the Kingdom of God of peace, justice and well-being. – Fr. Ben, MSC

Updates:

1. To the question of returning to communion in both species (Body and Blood), I got only 7 responses agreeing to it. Maybe others are just waiting for it to return; still others believe that the sacred host is the living Body of Christ; therefore, the precious blood is in it. In point of fact, only the Catholic Church in the United States has made the communion in both species a regular practice in all masses.

2. Thank you for supporting our Young People and the Youth Ministry in their participation in the Youth Day, LA Religious Education Congress in Anaheim last February 20, 2025. There were 30 young people who joined, riding in two 15-seater vans. Their drivers: our two adult women in the Youth Ministry.

Más profundamente, debemos preguntarnos: ¿quiénes están causando estas guerras? ¿No nos estamos ofreciendo a nosotros mismos y a nuestros hijos a los teatros de la guerra y al altar de la violencia, no para nosotros mismos, aunque nos hagan creerlo, sino para unos pocos que quieren controlar la geopolítica de los recursos y el poder? La guerra, su violencia y sus horrores son la antítesis del Reino de Dios de paz, justicia y bienestar. – Padre Ben, MSC

Queridos feligreses de OLPH:

Sigamos reflexionando en oración sobre el llamado del Santo Padre Francisco a ser peregrinos de la esperanza en este Año Jubilar 2025, al mismo tiempo que continuamos rezando por su salud y su bienestar total.

“Signos de esperanza”

“7. Además de alcanzar la esperanza que nos da la gracia de Dios, también estamos llamados a redescubrirla en los signos de los tiempos que el Señor nos ofrece. Como afirma el Concilio Vaticano II, «es deber permanente de la Iglesia escrutar a fondo los signos de la época e interpretarlos a la luz del Evangelio, de forma que, acomodándose a cada generación, pueda la Iglesia responder a los perennes interrogantes de la humanidad sobre el sentido de la vida presente y de la vida futura y sobre la mutua relación de ambas». [4] Por ello, es necesario poner atención a todo lo bueno que hay en el mundo para no caer en la tentación de considernos superados por el mal y la violencia. En este sentido, los signos de los tiempos, que contienen el anhelo del corazón humano, necesitado de la presencia salvífica de Dios, requieren ser transformados en signos de esperanza.

8. Que el primer signo de esperanza se traduzca en paz para el mundo, el cual vuelve a encontrarse sumergido en la tragedia de la guerra.
